In his poem, "We are Second and You are First," Walter Brueggeman writes: "Before our well-being, there was your graciousness, before our delight, there was your generosity, before our joy, there was your goodwill.

We are second and you are first."

At our fall officer retreat, your elders chose "corporate prayer" as APC's theme for 2014. It was eight years ago that APC had its first annual theme, which was, fittingly, prayer. Officer Spotlight: Elder Steve Porter

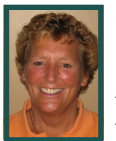

Children's Chatter

All Children's Ministry programs are now in full swing at APC. At times I am prone to take for granted the impact our Children's Ministry has on each child. In most cases it is easy to see if a child enjoys Children's Church, Sunday School or Explorers or is having a difficult time. Other children are a little bit trickier to read. However, I would say children let their likes and dislikes be known.

For the past couple of years, we have honed in on curriculums for our children's programs that reflect gospel-centered teaching. In the first and second grade Sunday school class I teach, we are studying the Book of Judges. You may be surprised to read this. We are using a curriculum called *One Story* that takes children through every book of the Bible in seven years. This may sound ambitious, but the children enjoy the curriculum format.

Each week in our class, we review the cycle in Judges: the people rebel, God is angry, enemies oppress, the people cry out (repentance), salvation is given through chosen judge, peace, the judge dies. As we look at this cycle, it is easy to see traces of the gospel. After our review, we spend time on memory verses, and dig into the chapter we are studying. The lesson is designed like an inductive Bible study: the children answer observation questions, interpret what is going on and make some applications to their own lives.

There are three children's Sunday School classes using *One Story*. It is delightful to see how the children connect with the Word of God and are excited to be in class. Sara Eppright told me a couple of weeks ago that her daughter, Lydia, thought her class was "awesome." That is quite a compliment from a first grader! Her comment demonstrates to us that the time we spend investing in the children of APC does matter and is having a significant impact in their lives. Please thank our Sunday School teachers for all they do to teach our children. Take note of what God is doing in the lives of our children. Don't take it for granted!
