As I consider building and ministry preparation, I'm most thankful and deeply encouraged by the HOW. How are we preparing? Prayerfully! Building preparations include much continued

physical work (the latest happenings and pictures are posted and updated every few weeks at www.alexandriapres.org/building). Even more preparation is happening within the various committees as they continue to oversee the work, make decisions, reach out to our neighbors, and make ready for a new worship center on West Braddock Road. More committees will be formed, more decisions will be made, and more preparation is needed now so we are ready this Spring. But the real preparation is happening on our knees as we pray for our building and neighbors and workers, but most importantly for the Gospel to remain the main thing (not a physical building).

Our ministry leaders are praying now, asking God to reveal His vision for what their ministry will look like. As they look ahead, they are thinking creatively, being flexible, and crying out to the Lord asking for wisdom, asking to be filled with the Holy Spirit, and asking for Him to provide clear direction for their ministries. I'm so thankful! And it is encouraging to know we worship a God who hears these prayers, who joins us in these prayers, and who answers these prayers.

Additionally, as a congregation we are praying. Praying for the committees, praying for the ministry leaders, praying for ourselves. So many are stepping out to be part of this Gospel community - to live out APC's mission - to be part of God's kingdom work! Volunteering, praying, being on a committee, working behind the scenes, serving in full view. We are preparing now for something bigger. We have been called to stretch now. We need all hands on deck - every member doing their part. This does not happen without prayer. And God is doing a good and deep work in our midst, not just building up a physical building. Much like the building progress, much of which is hidden behind the outer structure or going on under the surface (like our basement being built below the surface which includes the nursery, children and adult classrooms, a kitchen, fellowship hall and more), God is offering an opportunity for us to grow deeper roots in Him. We firmly believe and we are praying that He is growing our roots now to support the growth that He will provide.

It is exciting that God is inviting each of us to be a part of growing His kingdom. Please pray for our ministry leaders. Please pray for our physical building. Please pray for our spiritual building - the building up of each and every person's life of faith and repentance and humble reliance on Christ alone. Please pray for the building and ministry preparation.

Alexandria Presbyterian Church is a welcoming community of believers, rejoicing in the gospel, transformed by its power, and responding with grateful hearts in service to our God and world. We long to taste the glory of God in such an astonishing way that the city of Alexandria will be drawn to the majesty and mercy of our great God.
