MINISTRIES AT APC

Covenant Fellowship Groups (CFGs). CFGs are small groups that meet regularly in various locations for teaching, prayer, and fellowship, and are a key vehicle at APC for promoting Gospel-centered fellowship.

Covenant Kids Children's Ministry. Children are an active and growing part of the APC family! Children's Church is available during Sunday worship to provide children a worship service on their level. Covenant Kids meets Sunday evenings for children ages five through 5th grade to build relationships, study the Bible, and learn to live for Christ in every aspect of life.

Youth Ministry. PROTAS is a dynamic, teen-led, adult-mentored, relationship-based, youth community with the goal of teens becoming strong disciples of Christ as they reach out to their lost friends. This happens through exciting outreach events, relevant and challenging instruction from a Biblically reformed perspective, small discipleship groups, and loving Christ-like service to those in need.

Men's and Women's Ministries. Men and Women enjoy times of fellowship and community throughout the year. Bible studies and events are planned with a variety of opportunities for teaching, fellowship, and social activities. Bi-annual retreats are also planned for men and women separately.

Koinonia. Koinonia is a community of people in their twenties through their thirties who meet for ongoing fellowship opportunities.

Seniors' Ministry. APC invites seniors to be active in each aspect of our worship, community, and equipping. We offer a Bible study at a nearby senior living facility and transportation to and from worship on Sunday mornings.

Spanish Worship Service. This monthly worship service includes singing, prayer, and a sermon– all in Spanish.

Music Ministry. APC's music ministry teams aim to magnify God's greatness, and to model and encourage the gospel-motivated, heart-engaged, Spirit-reliant worship of the gathered church. The Worship Team, Adult Choir, Youth Choirs, and Tech Team all contribute to special services like the Lessons and Carols Service, and additionally serve in various capacities throughout the year.

Sunday Adult Education. APC offers an array of classes on Sunday evenings at 5pm for further spiritual development. One upcoming class is Walking in the Spirit, which is a 10 week in-depth study of the person and work of the Holy Spirit. Other classes covering a variety of topics are offered to help believers learn and grow in Christ.

Mercy Ministry. Our deacons have a Biblical mandate (Acts 6) to address needs within the Body of Christ, so we have a monthly Deacons' Fund collection to provide the resources to help people. Funds are used to help both those within our congregation and those in our surrounding community.

Missions. We presently support 11 domestic and 15 overseas missionaries, as well as various mission-related needs within our PCA denomination. Missionary profiles can be found in the Member Area of our website, and we also hear updates from our missionaries periodically from the pulpit.
