It seeks to achieve that mission through 5 objectives: Expose those in the government community to the transforming truths of the gospel through healthy relationships; Provide encouragement and support in the development of a Biblical world and life view for those in government who make a profession of faith; Strive to be instrumental in establishing and maintaining a Biblical conscience throughout the government community who both create and implement policy; Provide a healthy means to connect the church in a non-partisan manner with those in government; Promote and facilitate specific and intelligent prayer by the body of Christ for those serving in government.


