Covenant Kids Ministry: Children 2 years old - 5th grade, Lower Level (Nursery for 1 & under). Children learn foundational truths about God and the Gospel story. Biblical Track - "Seeing Christ in the Old Testament," Led by Elder Aaron Renenger, Main Level Conference Room (Room 114). We'll trace the overarching narrative from Genesis to Malachi, highlighting how Christ is anticipated and present throughout.


