Spring Key Equipping Opportunities: Sunday Nights from 5pm to 7pm

**Covenant Kids Ministry: Children 2 years old - 5th grade, Lower Level (Nursery for 1 & under).** Children learn foundational truths about God and the Gospel story. We experience what it looks like to love God and love others in community with our worship, small groups, teaching, games, fellowship, and dinner!

**PROTAS Youth Ministry: Teens 6th-12th grade, Upper Level.** Connect each week in community with your peers — the schedule includes games, worship, small group discussions, a short devotion at a teen level, and dinner.

**Adults:** Come to learn, study, pray, and be transformed as each class offers opportunities to be equipped as a disciple of Christ. No meals provided for adults. Classes offered:

**Foundational Track - “Walking in the Spirit (WitS),” led by Pastor Tom and Sharon Holliday, Room 201 (Registration is closed)**  
This is a 10-week in-depth study of the person and work of the Holy Spirit. Each class will consist of an hour of teaching followed by an hour of small group interaction, as well as reflection and homework during the week. Since each week builds upon the previous week, we ask that you commit to being present in at least 8 of the 10 weeks.

**Biblical Track - “The Book of Romans,” led by Elder Aaron Renenger and Shant Boyajian, Room 112 (Open to all)**  
Martin Luther once described his experience upon reading the Book of Romans, and finally grasping its message, like this: “I felt myself to be reborn and to have gone through open doors into paradise.” Join us as we explore the core tenets of Christianity as set forth in Romans, including the depravity of man, salvation by grace through faith, reconciliation with God, Christian freedom, and Christian living.

Mark 13 (pg. 798)

Please open your Bibles to Mark 13 and find selected portions below.

1 And as he came out of the temple, one of his disciples said to him, “Look, Teacher, what wonderful stones and what wonderful buildings!” 2 And Jesus said to him, “Do you see these great buildings? There will not be left here one stone upon another that will not be thrown down.”

3 And as he sat on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter and James and John and Andrew asked him privately, 4 “Tell us, when will these things be, and what will be the sign when all these things are about to be accomplished?” 5 And Jesus began to say to them, “See that no one leads you astray. 6 Many will come in my name, saying, ‘I am he!’ and they will lead many astray. 7 And when you hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not be alarmed. This must take place, but the end is not yet. 8 For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. These are but the beginning of the birth pains.

9 “But be on your guard. For they will deliver you over to councils, and you will be beaten in synagogues, and you will stand before governors and kings for my sake, to bear witness before them. 10 And the gospel must first be proclaimed to all nations. 11 And when they bring you to trial and deliver you over, do not be anxious beforehand what you are to say, but say whatever is given you in that hour, for it is not you who speak, but the Holy Spirit.

12 “But in those days, after that tribulation, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, 13 and the stars will be falling from heaven, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. 14 And then they will see the Son of Man coming in clouds with great power and glory. 15 And then he will send out the angels and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven.

16 “From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts out its leaves, you know that summer is near. 17 So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he is near, at the very gates. 18 Truly, I say to you, this generation will not pass away until all these things take place. 19 Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

20 “But concerning that day or that hour, no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. 21 Be on guard, keep awake. For you do not know when the time will come. 22 It is like a man going on a journey, when he leaves home and puts his servants in charge, each with his work, and commands the doorkeeper to stay awake. 23 Therefore stay awake—for you do not know when the master of the house will come, in the evening, or at midnight, or when the rooster crows, or in the morning— 24 lest he come suddenly and find you asleep. 25 And what I say to you I say to all: Stay awake.”

Explanation, Invitation, Participation
